



UPPER SCHOOL PROFILE

Randolph's Upper School is an engaging, challenging environment for students in 9th through 12th grade. We are proud of our rigorous academic program, wide-ranging extracurricular activities, nurturing environment, and culture of trust.

Beginning in 9th grade through graduation, our College Counseling Office works closely with students and families to provide the appropriate guidance and resources necessary to navigate the college admissions process. Our team strives to give every student the preparation and individual support they need to find the right fit for their university experience. Randolph graduates are not only prepared for acceptance to the higher institutions of their choice, but they are also ready to flourish there.

Virtually all Randolph graduates attend four-year colleges. Here are some statistics from the most recent graduating class (2022):

45% of students scored 30 or higher on the ACT or equivalent SAT score.

100% of students who sought merit-based financial aid received it.

59% have completed courses in Biology, Chemistry, and Physics and 53% have completed Calculus.

24% have taken four years of world language at the Upper School level.

Randolph School holds dual accreditation from SAIS/Cognia and is a member of the National, Southern and Alabama Associations of Independent Schools; the National and Southern Association for College Admission Counseling; The College Board; the National Honor Society; the Cum Laude Society; and Global Online Academy.

OUR STUDENT EXPERIENCE

We have 26 varsity teams playing 16 sports. 79% of our Upper School students participate in at least one sport; 35% play more than one sport. In the 2021-22 school year, students earned three team state championships, two first-runner up trophies, 14 individual state titles, and seven students will pursue their athletic endeavors in college.

The Upper School presents two major theater productions a year, as well as band and choir concerts. We offer a multitude of visual arts courses. 38% of recent graduating classes have taken four years of visual or performing arts. In the Class of 2022, 11 students plan to continue in the arts at the collegiate level as a major, minor, or in their free time.

All Randolph students adhere to a student-governed Honor System. The Community Learning Program connects them to meaningful service partnerships with organizations throughout North Alabama.

Interim Week gives every student the opportunity to learn outside the classroom through a wide array of trips, shadowing various careers, and service opportunities both locally and globally.

Summer Internships allow students to gain real world experience working in a professional setting in local businesses, research institutions, and governmental agencies. Participation is competitive.

In the Class of 2022, 99% of students took at least one Advanced Placement course, with 60% taking 3 or more.

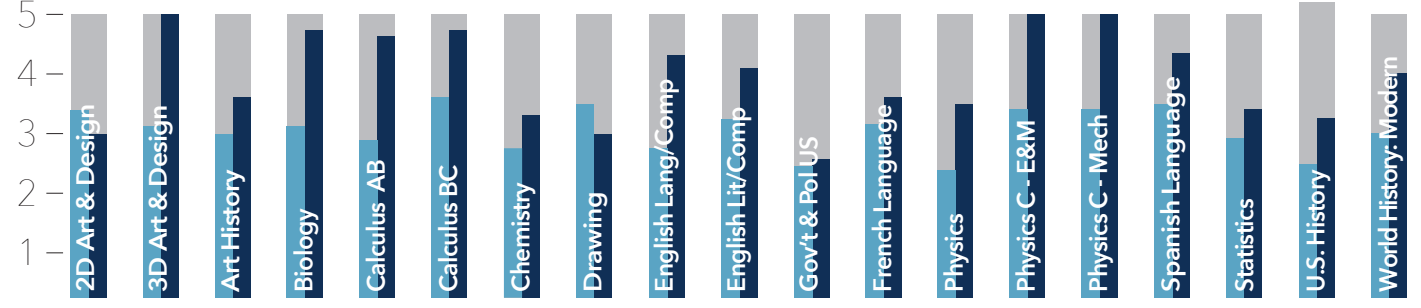

AP GUIDANCE

Randolph limits the number of Advanced Placement courses that each student may take. Ninth and tenth graders rarely take AP courses. Eleventh graders may take up to three courses;

Twelfth graders may take up to four courses. Students may petition to take one additional Advanced Placement course beyond this limit.
